Following is the status report on Fort Bend County FWSD#1 No. 1 projects:

Agenda Item No. 5 – Engineer's Report:

(a) Report on status of projects:

i)Gateway Acres Subdivision Wastewater Plumbing Contract (199 properties within original contract)

- Connection Update:
 - All properties (175) in the project, except those mentioned below, have been connected to the District's WW system, including having their private water wells plugged and wastewater tanks decommissioned...Project was declared Substantially Complete on 12-16-24...Contractor currently working on completing punchlist items in order to finalize project (grading, trash removal, issuance of final paperwork, etc...)
 - 24 properties were removed from project due to a) properties not securing or properly maintaining water service, b) were not a single-family residential property, c) paid for and installed a wastewater connection prior to the plumbing project, d) connected to the District's wastewater collection system illegally, e) structure not in a condition to connect to, f) well plugging issues (DA to update), and g) unresolved matters related to illegal water connections (Inframark to update)
- Request Board's approval of Invoice No. 5 from Terracon for material testing services for \$1,135.00
- Request Board's approval of PE No. 1 from AR Turnkee Construction Company Inc. for construction of the project for \$635,913.00
- Contractor requesting reduction in retainage from 10% to 5%...discuss with Board
- ii) City of Arcola WWTP Expansion Project (0.675 MGD to 0.95 MGD)...District will have 0.35 MGD of WWTP Capacity
 - Per correspondence from CoA, a remaining punchlist item for the project (startup of an aeration blower) needs to be completed in order for the project to be declared complete...afterwards District will need final invoice from CoA to process and make payment and correspondence to TCEQ that project has been completed
- iii) Fresno Ranchos Subdivision Wastewater Collection System

(g) Potential Emergency Water Interconnect with BCMUD21/22

- BCMUD21/22 agreed to District only having to pay ½ of the construction cost of the interconnect vault, with a NTE value of \$75k...DA is handling completion of agreement between parties for all to review/approve
- Submitted to Patrick Newton, Engineer (LJA) for BCMUD21/22, the District's thoughts regarding the potential emergency water interconnect between our Districts (location at end of East Sycamore Road)
 - a. Vault to be located at the District's eastern boundary line.
 - b. Work within the District to upsize the existing 8" waterline to a 12" waterline would consist of predominately trenchless construction (no open cutting driveways).

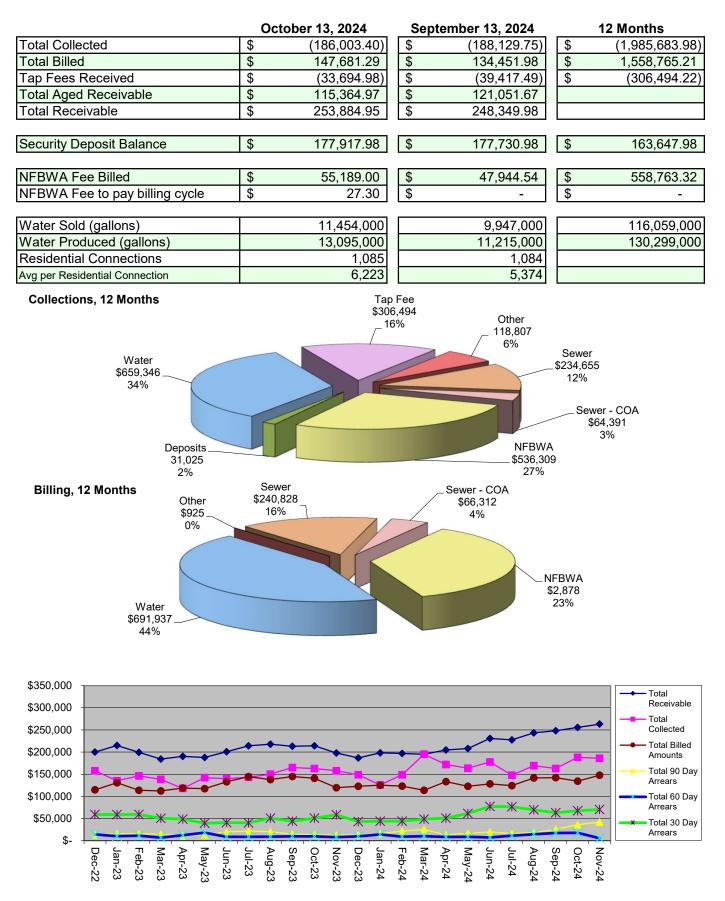

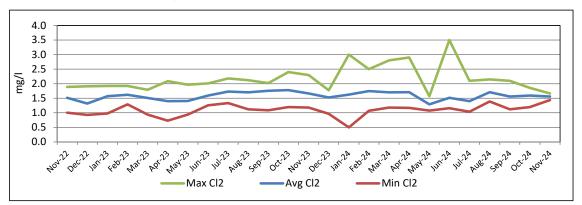

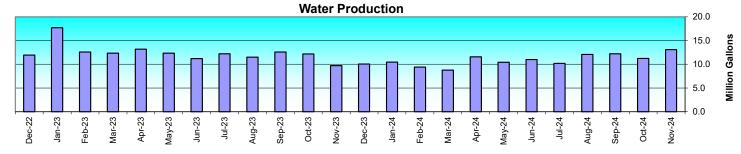

The Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of Fort Bend County Fresh Water Supply District No. 1 of Fort Bend County, Texas (the "District"), met in regular session, open to the public, at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 21, 2024, at 4521 F.M. 521 North, Fresno, Fort Bend County, Texas 77545, a designated meeting place inside the boundaries of the District, and the roll was called of the members of the Board, to wit:

Paul Hamilton Rosa Linda Medina Calvin Casher Rodrigo Carreon Erasto Vallejo President Vice-President Secretary Assistant Secretary Assistant Secretary

All members of the Board were present, except Supervisor Vallejo, thus constituting a quorum.

Also present at the meeting were: Cindy Grimes with Municipal Accounts & Consulting, LP, the District's Bookkeeper ("MAC"); David Dybala with Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. ("Jacobs"), the District's Engineer; Robert Cardenas and Justin Ubernosky with Inframark, LLC ("Inframark"), the District's Operator; and Christopher Cunningham and Michael R. Willis of Sanford Kuhl Hagan Kugle Parker Kahn LLP ("SK Law"), the District's Attorney.

The meeting was called to order at 6:04 p.m. and the following business was transacted.

1. HEAR FROM PUBLIC (MATTERS ON THE AGENDA)

At this time, the Board opened the meeting to comments from the public.

2. <u>UPDATE ON SANITARY SEWER EASEMENTS ALONG TRAMMEL FRESNO ROAD AND</u> PROPOSED WWTP SITE ON NAILL ROAD

Mr. Willis then updated the Board on the pending sanitary sewer easements and proposed WWTP site. Mr. Willis advised the Board that the condemnation attorneys have not been able to negotiate access to the proposed WWTP site for the purposes of geotechnical and environmental testing. In connection therewith, Mr. Willis requested authorization for the condemnation attorneys to file an injunction to allow access.

Upon motion duly made by Supervisor Casher, seconded by Supervisor Carreon, the Board voted unanimously to authorize McFarland PLLC to file an injunction to gain access to the proposed WWTP site.

Mr. Willis then presented the draft sundial easement prepared by Fort Bend County. Mr. Willis noted that Mr. Dybala had not yet reviewed the proposed easement document.

Upon motion duly made by Supervisor Casher, seconded by Supervisor Carreon, the Board voted unanimously to approve the sundial easement, subject to final comment from the engineer and attorney.

3. BOOKKEEPER'S REPORT AND TAX ASSESSOR/COLLECTOR'S REPORT

The Board then considered the Bookkeeper's Report presented by Ms. Grimes, a copy of which is on file in the official records of the District, and the invoices and checks presented for payment as follows:

The Board reviewed the bills presented for payment, including the invoices discussed in more detail under the Engineer's Report.

B. <u>Review Investment Report.</u>

The Board reviewed the investment report.

C. Review Collateral Pledge Report.

The Board reviewed the Collateral Pledge report.

Ms. Grimes then presented the Tax Report from the Fort Bend County Tax Office.

Upon motion duly made by Supervisor Medina, seconded by Supervisor Casher, the Board voted unanimously (i) to approve the Bookkeeper's Report; (ii) to authorize the payment of the checks and invoices listed therein; and (3) to approve the Tax Report.

4. ENGINEER'S REPORT

- i)Gateway Acres Subdivision Wastewater Plumbing Contract (199 properties within original contract)
 - Connection Update:
 - Approximately 155 properties connected to District's WW System...of those, 97 properties are fully complete, including issuance of green door hanger to resident, and the remaining still require some additional work for the property to be considered fully complete
 - I6 properties were removed from project due to a) properties not securing or properly maintaining water service, b) were not a singlefamily residential property, c) paid for and installed a wastewater connection prior to the plumbing project, and d) connected to the District's wastewater collection system illegally

Upon motion made by Supervisor Medina, seconded by Supervisor Casher, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve (1) approve Invoice No. 4 from Terracon for material testing in the amount of \$3,608.75; and (2) the Engineer's Report, as presented.

5. OPERATOR'S REPORT/TERMINATION OF SERVICE

Next the Board recognized Mr. Cardenas, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board the Operator's Report, a copy of which is on file in the official records of the District.

A. <u>Repairs to Water and Wastewater systems</u>

Mr. Cardenas reported substantial system repairs and maintenance as follows:

- Inframark cleared tall grass around lift station no. 2.
- Inframark completed the lead and copper service line inventory.
- Inframark fueled the generator at WP 1.
- Inframark completed the lubrication preventative maintenance on all equipment at WP 1 and WP 2.
- Inframark repaired fence from storm damage at WP 1.
- Inframark repaired a tap line at 603 S. Locust.
- Inframark installed a new hydrant at 3306 Maryland.
- Inframark installed a sewer tap at 1318 Avenue A, 1707 Avenue A, 1611 Avenue D, 1714 Avenue D#A, 3710 Gettie, 3622 Lissie and 415 Renfro Burford.
- Inframark installed a water tap at 1603 Avenue A, 1611 Avenue D, 1714 Avenue D, 1714 Avenue D#A, 420 Cypress Avenue, 514 Cypress Avenue, 1318 Evergreen, and 750 N. Locust.

Mr. Cardenas then updated the Board on the following:

- 1. <u>Storage Building for Portable Generator:</u> Inframark is quoting this.
- 2. <u>Manhole Survey</u>: Inframark is working on the manhole survey for the District at a cost of \$55 per manhole, or a total of \$9,625.00. This is in progress.
- 3. <u>Diesel Reserve Tank:</u> Mr. Cardenas presented a quote for a diesel reserve tank at Water Plant.
- 4. <u>Portable Generator</u>: Mr. Cardenas presented a quote for a portable generator for the District's lift stations. Mr. Dybala is reviewing.
- 5. <u>FM 521 Road Widening Relocation</u>: The Board authorized the relocation plan proposed by Texas Hot Taps at the October meeting for the estimated amount of \$70,956.36. Subsequently, the estimate was amended to \$53,233.70. This is in progress. Mr. Cardenas requested approval subject to Mr. Dybala's review.

B. <u>Requests for Water Taps</u>

Mr. Cardenas did not report any requests at this time.

C. Delinquent Water Accounts and Service Terminations

Mr. Cardenas provided a confidential list of customers that received a delinquent letter by mail and are subject to disconnection of service.

Mr. Cardenas also presented one write-off in the amount of \$602.12, and indicated there was illegal usage on the account. The meter will be pulled. Mr. Cardenas further stated that an insurance claim will be filed related to the fence repair.

Upon a motion duly made by Supervisor Casher, seconded by Supervisor Medina, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Operator's Report, the recommended write-offs, the repairs to the water and wastewater system, the leak adjustment requests, and the termination list.

6. ATTORNEY'S REPORT

The Board recognized Mr. Willis, who presented the Attorney's report as follows:

A. Approval of Minutes

The proposed minutes of the meeting held on September 19, 2024, were presented for approval.

Upon motion duly made by Supervisor Carreon, seconded by Supervisor Medina, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes of September 19, 2024, as presented.

B. <u>Regional Facilities Contract</u>

The Board noted there was no action necessary in connection with the Regional Facilities Contract.

C. Adopt Covered Applications and Prohibited Technology Policy

Mr. Willis informed the Board that Texas Government Code Section 620.003 requires that political subdivisions of the State of Texas adopt a policy prohibiting the installation or use of a covered application as defined by Texas Government Code Section 620.001(1) on any device owned or leased by the governmental entity and requiring the removal of covered applications from those devices. He requested that the Board adopt the Order Adopting Covered Applications and Prohibited Technology Policy in compliance with such requirements.

Upon motion by Supervisor Carreon, seconded by Supervisor Casher, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the Order Adopting Covered Applications and Prohibited Technology Policy.

D. Authorize Auditor to prepare audit for fiscal year ending December 31, 2024

Mr. Willis then presented to the Board a letter from McCall Gibson Swedlund Barfoot PLLC requesting authorization to prepare the District's audit for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2024 (the "Audit").

Upon motion duly made by Supervisor Casher, seconded by Supervisor Carreon, the Board voted unanimously to authorize preparation of the Audit.

7. PROPOSAL TO RENEW INSURANCE

Mr. Willis presented to the Board a proposal from McDonald & Wessendorff Insurance to renew the District's insurance policies (the "Renewal Policy").

Upon motion duly made by Supervisor Casher, seconded by Supervisor Carreon, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Renewal Policy.

8. <u>REGIONAL PLANT COMMITTEE REPORT</u>

The Board then considered the Regional Plant Committee Report.

Upon a motion made by Supervisor Casher, seconded by Supervisor Carreon, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Regional Plant Committee Report.

9. HEAR FROM THE PUBLIC.

The Board then opened the meeting to comments from the public.

There being no further business to come before the Board, upon a motion duly made and seconded, the Board voted unanimously to adjourn.

The treatment plant operation information was received by Paul Hamilton from Municipal Operations & Consultants.

WWTP Operations Report:

During the period of October 2024, per the attached MOC monthly report, the WWTP was operating at 34% of the 0.675 MGD permit capacity and was operating within permit parameters. Arcola had 17% inflow and Freshwater-1 had 17% inflow. During the same period as above, the plant average daily flow was 229,290 gallons of which Freshwater 1 was 113,647 gallons. Total rainfall for the period was 0.25 inches.

WWTP Discharge Monitoring Report:

The October 2024 Discharge Monitoring Report (DMR) did not reflect any parameter exceedances. A copy of the DMR is attached.

WWTP Operations Expenses

The WWTP total expenses for September 4, 2024 through November 5, 2024 was \$7,996.26. \$1,000 for MOC monthly services plus \$ 6,996.26 for ancillary supplies and activities. See the various expenses on pages 6 through 11 of the Bookkeepers Invoice Report section.
